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## **New Year, New Financial** Resolutions

It's that time again — time to start a new year with a clean slate and a new set of priorities. Here are some financial resolutions you can actually keep.

#### Fill spending gaps.

Examine your monthly subscriptions and see if you are still using all of them. If not, cancel those and guit wasting your money



on something you are not using. For example, did everyone start watching movies on Netflix instead of those spendy premium cable channels? See if you can drop down a tier and save some money. Same goes with Netflix or other streaming services. If no one has logged on in months, guit the services.

#### Get fees under control.

Take a look at your statements from last year and see how much you spent on fees, whether for late credit card payments, insufficient funds, or account service charges. Are there ways to minimize these fees? Such as making sure your payments are all made on time or that deposits are made before automated withdrawals happen.

Do you need to switch to an account with lower fees? (Hint: We typically offer lower fees than many banks, so consider moving your loans and deposit accounts here to Palisades Credit Union. We can help make the switch easy.)

### Make sure your insurance is up-to-date.

Did you make any big purchases over the holidays, such as a new television or jewelry? Consult your insurance agent to see if you need to add a rider to your homeowners or renters insurance to cover these new items.

### Automate your money.

Want to save \$100 per month? Automate that so you do not have to remember to make it happen. If you get direct deposit from your employer, check to see if you can have your desired savings amount sent to your savings account from each check and the balance sent to your checking account. If not, then set an automatic transfer a day or two after your pay check is deposited. We can help you with that.

### Make your savings work harder.

Are you depending on a standard savings account for your long-term savings? Those accounts are great because money is easily accessible when you need it, but rates tend to be low. Consider a certificate or money market account to increase your earnings on your savings. And make an appointment with our investment services team to discuss stocks, bonds, and other investment tools that can earn dramatically higher interest rates than standard share accounts.

These resolutions can all help you reach your short- and longterm financial goals, but there is one step you'll also want to take to make sure you stick with them: Set clear, concise objectives. Even the most powerful financial resolution will be easy to ditch if you forget why you want to do it. Keep your goals firmly in mind each time you look at your finances this year so you can stick to your resolutions and end the year where you want to be.

# **Tech Tools Can Help You Reach Your Money Goals**

Technology has made it so easy to spend — you can buy groceries, order lunch, or even get a completely new wardrobe right from your phone. But you can also use technology to help you save and stay informed about your finances.

Here are the big ways technology can help you reach your money goals.

#### You can see where your money is going.

Using the personal finance manager in online banking, check to see what percentage of your spending goes to housing, utilities, food, entertainment, or any other category you would like to track. To get this type of information, you used to have to save receipts, log expenses by category, and then calculate how much goes into each category. If you find that you are spending more than you'd like in one category, you can decide how to make cuts, then keep using online banking to track your progress.

#### You can automate your payments — so you do not forget.

Use online banking to send your payments each month. Just choose the date and the amount, and then set it as a recurring payment. You can also choose to receive certain bills right in online banking and pay them automatically.

#### You can also automate your savings.

Set an automatic transfer from checking into savings each month to make sure you never miss your savings goals. Or ask if your employer can split your direct deposit into your saving and checking accounts automatically.

### You can get alerts that keep you informed.

Sign up for alerts in online banking when deposits are made, when specific transactions occur (such as those over a specified dollar amount), when bills are due, if your account hits a certain balance, or other events so you know exactly what is going on with your money at all times.

### You can find coupons and deals.

Money saving apps abound. For example, your favorite grocery store may have an app that connects you to coupons or sales on the items you already buy. Other apps, such as Ebates or Ibotta, give you rebates on in-store and online shopping. As with any shopping, though, try to stick with the items you were already planning to buy.



### You can connect with others working toward the same goals.

Social media sites may have groups of people working toward specific financial objectives. For example, look on Facebook for groups of people trying to save more for retirement or take low-cost trips. Or check Twitter for hashtags targeted toward your money goals. You might be surprised how many people are pursuing the same goals — and how much you can learn from each other.

# 2019 Board of Director Nominations

Palisades Credit Union is a member owned full service financial institution. Each member has the right and the opportunity to help by volunteering on committees and on the Board of Directors. Once a year, Palisades CU conducts a formal nominating and election process for our Board of Directors. This year, the Palisades CU Nominating Committee has nominated the following members to the Board:

#### **Pamela Wiss**

Mrs. Wiss retired from Wyeth Pharmaceuticals after 34 years. Pam received her degree in Biological Sciences from Rutgers University. She has been a Palisades FCU Board member since 1990 and currently serves as the Chair of the Board of Directors. She was previously the Chair of the Supervisory Committee and had held this position for almost 30 years. She bring to Palisades FCU's Board, experience from serving on the New Jersey Pharmaceutical Quality Assurance Association Board for a five-year term, during which time she filled each one of its officer positions.

#### **Tammy Gamble**

Ms. Gamble worked for Wyeth Pharmaceuticals/Lederle Laboratories for over 20 years. During her Wyeth career, she held many leadership roles, and served in various positions in both Quality Assurance and Manufacturing. Tammy received her Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy from the Purdue University College of Pharmacy. She is designated as a Certified Quality Auditor from the American Society of Quality. Tammy has been on Palisades FCU's Board of Directors for three years and currently serves as the Board Secretary. She served on the Palisades FCU Supervisory Committee for over 10 years and held the position of Vice-Chair.

Tammy is designated as a CUNA Certified Credit Union Board member and is a graduate of NACUSAC University, a 12-course program for Credit Union Supervisory and Auditing Committees.

Nominations may also be made by members by means of a petition containing the signatures of at least 1% of the members eligible to vote with a minimum of 20 and a maximum of 500. To be valid, nominations by petition must be submitted with brief biographical data of the candidate to include past and present work experience, education, civic involvement, a brief statement (50 words or less) as to why he/she wants to serve on the Board of Directors, and a signed certificate from the nominee stating that he/she is agreeable to the nomination and will serve if elected to office. Regular terms of office are three years. The Board meets monthly as required by the bylaws and at more frequent intervals as necessary.

Petitions for nomination must be submitted to the Secretary of the Board of Directors, c/o Palisades Federal Credit Union, 300 N. Middletown Road, Suite #6, Pearl River, NY 10965 and received by Thursday, February 28, 2019.
